For the last eight years I have been going to Duncan J. Schoular Elementary School in Smiths Falls to engage in various art activities with the children. In the beginning I was teaching little art lessons at lunch time to an art club and also attending several classrooms where I taught a weekly art lesson.

More recently it has just been the lunch time art club. What I have learned, is that most of the time just showing up with art materials is enough. Many of these children live in families who aren't able to buy them art supplies. Even markers and colour pencils aren't always available at home.

Some children attend because of a love of art, and where I can, I fit in some instruction.

Many of the children come because just one more caring adult is of great benefit to them.

It was shocking to me how badly schools are equipped with art supplies. Even older children are trying to paint with kindergarten type bristle brushes, using watercolour paints, One of the first things I did was bring in a huge box of softer brushes in various sizes. I have been fortunate through the years to be given funding by The Canadian Federation of University Women which has allowed the children to be exposed to many other mediums. I also like to help students develop better skills if art is their real area to shine, when sometimes they are not experiencing academic success. I cannot tell you how much joy this activity brings me. My first day back, since the pandemic, was the second day mask mandates were lifted. Both the principal and I had tears in our eyes at being able to finally give the children something extra. I would encourage anybody with a free lunchtime, to think of doing something similar at a local school. Life is best when there are some children to spend time with.

I have been spending a lot of time recently with a very engaging character called Waldemar Januszczak. He is an art critic and documentary presenter who has a Polish name and a London accent. He has dozens of documentaries on You Tube, covering all kinds of art, artists and even history. And I am totally hooked.

I started with a series he did on the Impressionists, another on Van Gogh and still another on Gauguin. From that I found some fascinating stuff about the Italian Renaissance and some of its famous painters. Did you know Caravaggio was a murderer, or that Botticelli means little barrel?
